



Introduction:

This booklet contains information relating to Alternative providers who have been approved and are able to use the Local Authority Alternative Provision framework.

Although providers are accepted onto the Alternative Provision framework, they still have to complete the Local Authority Quality Assurance Audit and the Local Authority Quality Assurance Process.

The Local Authority Quality Assurance Audit (QAA) process:

The Local Authority has a duty to assess any service that is commissioned to deliver services for children and young people, to ensure full compliance with the requirements set out in the Children Act 2004. All services are routinely inspected (QAA) at the start of the contracting period, prior to the placement of any child or young person. An QAA looks at following:

- Leadership and Accountability
- Use of policies and procedures to safeguard children.
- Recruitment and Selection
- Staff Induction, Training and Development
- Complaints Allegations and Whistle-blowing
- Information Sharing, communication & Confidentiality
- Listening to Children and Young People

There is no RAG rating as part of this process, the provider has either met or not met the Standards as set out in Section 11 of the Children Act 2014. The Quality assurance Team will start the full Quality Assurance Process once the Quality Assurance Audit has been met.

The Local Authority Quality Assurance process:

Quality Assurance is the systematic and transparent process of checking to see if a service meets the specified requirements, and actively involves itself in the assessment against agreed thresholds and standards, to determine the level of quality.

Full QA inspections are carried out on an annual basis; while monitoring visits are scheduled intermittently, to check progress against the quality improvement plan (QIP) created at the initial visit.

Standard Rating (Rag ratings) are judgements made in conjunction with the Local Authorities framework, along with any existing framework by which that provider is judged, for example Ofsted. Any existing grading, judgements or recommendations will be considered within the evidence base as part of this localised framework. The Quality Assurance Bench Marking report will be a reflection of the annual; QA Visit and in relation to the evidence and observations made on the day. Where there is no rating present, this will be due to no students being in attendance on the date of inspection and therefore the Quality Team were unable to assess that area.

Although Quality Improvement Plans (QIP) are monitored throughout the year; services will be encouraged to routinely set their own annual QIP as a recognised approach to good practice.

Description of the provider: Big Picture Doncaster is commissioned by the City of Doncaster Council as part of the early intervention strategy. The focus of the provision is supporting young people who struggle with the challenges of transitioning to secondary school, or maintaining a successful position in mainstream education, with the aim of ensuring they can remain without the need for further, more complex intervention at a later stage, and crucially before they are disillusioned and distanced from school.

This is delivered through a relational approach that enables us to devise a curriculum that is relevant to the learner, and in doing so build in challenge and rigour. Wellbeing and self-confidence grow through self-determination (Ryan & Deci, 2000) so that the young person is able to see education as something that they can succeed in, and as such will enable them to continue this success in full time mainstream education.

We work from three design principles that we have in common with our Big Picture colleagues in the United States and around the globe:

- Learning must be based on each individual's interests and needs.
- The curriculum must be relevant to the learners and allow them to do real work in the real world.
- Learners' growth and abilities must be measured by the quality of their work and how it changes them.

As well as learners that are beginning to struggle with behavioural expectations, Big Picture also has a strong success rate with learners returning to school or adjusting to secondary school with a personal and social focus which includes behaviour, anxiety, friendships, decision making etc.

Currently Big Picture has a success rate of over 90% of learners deemed to have made progress under local authority QA processes. Schools with a close working relationship are complimentary about the support offered, the level of intervention and involvement in ensuring integrated work, as well as the impact on young people going on well beyond the end of a placement.

From September 2024 Big Picture Doncaster will be offering 24 places for years 7 and 8 students, and 24 places for learners in years 5 and 6 on a termly basis.

These will be twelve week placements for a maximum of two and a half days a week, and the offer will be further supplemented with follow up work in school where required, and 80 outreach places to support year 6 children with transition in the Summer and Spring Term of 2025.

Outreach support will be through weekly sessions delivered on a 1-2-1 basis and, as with on site placements, will follow a bespoke programme for each learner.

A highly personalised learning experience, defined by a personalised learning plan, with daily
advisory driven by the learner's interests in combination with the experience and expertise of
our staff.

- A learning platform devised with and specifically designed for Big Picture Doncaster to support learners in different learning environments that can also be access in school during and beyond the placement.
- A guiding partnership among learners, parents, advisors, mentors, local businesses, and the community where appropriate to learners' interest.
- A supportive learning environment, where learners are known and know one another well.
- A culture of learning, where young people learn in collaboration with advisors, families, professionals, and mentors.
- Learners work independently on interest-based projects daily in addition to advisory work around personal and social development to support them in mainstream school.
- Opportunities for all learners to present their work at exhibitions attended by family, schools, and other professionals and guests.
- A programme devised in conjunction with global leaders in personalised learning and learning through interests.
- The potential for learners to join global networks with other young people pursuing shared interests.
- As they progress and as it is appropriate our learners will have the opportunity to work off-site learning alongside advisors and mentors.
- A vibrant, flexible learning environment that provides equal access to all by adjusting instruction to address learner passions, abilities, and interests.
- Support for workforce development for staff in schools as well as access to local and wider networks of advisors to discuss and refine best practice in supporting the cohort.

Description of the provider: Changing Lives Alternative Therapeutic Provision is a Community Interest Company – Not for Profit The aim of the provision is to provide a therapeutic alternative service for children and young people who have difficulties in, or are disengaged from, education due to mental health difficulties, or have an identified therapeutic need.

We are based in a rural location, allowing a safe outdoor space and a herd of horses to aid our outcomes. We work with children and young people on our site, in school, in their homes and/or on outreach programs, we are very flexible and creative in our approach.

We do not offer curriculum-based education, our therapeutic work allows us to identify and resolve underlying psychological and emotional difficulties that impact on education.

Each child/young person referred to the service has an assessment to create a personalised care and intervention plan. Our support is holistic; therefore, we can work with the child, their parents/carers and their school, this means everyone supporting the child has the knowledge and skills to effectively help them long term.

At the end of our work, we provide an exit report which is shared with the child/young person's family and their school, providing clear recommendations and guidance.

- We will assess the child, family, and school's needs, developing an action plan. We use outcome measures to track the success of our interventions.
- We provide training and consultancy for parents/carers and professionals who have a key





We baseline for an assessment of social and emotional need, using generalised anxiety disorder scores, emotional intelligence scores, personalised risk assessment, and a detailed log of behaviours displayed. This would also be completed at the middle and end of placement to record and monitor the progress these assessments would then feed into an appropriate action plan and individualised package.

Opportunities to gain accreditation in national awards, to ensure building self-esteem and show it is possible to attain a great deal of accreditation, including first aid at work, Mountain Training Awards (we are the only education provision in the UK allowed to give these awards), Canoe England awards, AQA unit awards, evidence for accredited schools to gain BTEC, GCSE, or equivalent. If appropriate we now offer vocational awards in fire safety, health and safety in the workplace, first aid, manual handling, and food safety and hygiene level 2, NCFE level 1 and 2 in Engineering Process (some of our young people have designed and fabricated Christmas trees from horseshoes, other, have made BBQs from gas bottles).

Consistent staff for developing trust, stability with a proven track record of attaining the best outcomes for young people in Doncaster MBC.

Linking the learning done on session to core subjects, we explore a lot of academic work whilst on session and make it relevant to everyday life, such as budgeting a meal, measuring distance, working out timetables and tariffs, bike mechanics and first aid.

Providing a practical approach to the learning need of the young person, i.e., the learning will be done outdoors, in the community, it'll be relevant to lifelong learning, and practical.

Using SEAL and Nurture principles to help develop a wider emotional responses and behaviours and apply these in times of stress.

Using mindfulness, and counselling strategies to help reduce anxieties and stresses that present themselves, to allow fewer negative behaviours, with sessions from our in-house psychotherapist and NLP (Neuro Linguistic Programming) master practitioner to help feed into the young persons individualised package.

We aim to be as approachable and accommodating as we possibly can be as a company, in line with this we make ourselves available for transparent communication, as much as we can to both schools, authorities and carers.

Our phase one intervention is based around initially building rapport, normally in a small group. This allows us to move forwards at the young person's pace.

Phase two would be the young person trying three different activities, this would be generally outdoor education based (climbing, kayaking, navigation, bushcraft), however we can base these activities on art, mechanics and humanities .We would link learning and activities quite easily to this, in a practical way, e.g. a caving visit to a national trust live archaeological site, in which we would take part in collecting and processing Neolithic artefacts from the Peak District. During these sessions we also work on delivering 'core' subjects, for example the fire triangle, data handling, measuring with biking, kayaking, walking.

Phase three is where we specialise in an area that the young person excels or shows most interest in and we gain them national accreditation if possible (some accreditation is age restricted). We also start to work more intensively on social and emotional responses and self-regulation. We will push for emotional responses and then using SEAL and Nurture principles teach the young person how to regulate their actions.

Phase four is based on reintegration in which we share our reports and strategies with the next step in the young person's educational journey. We also would provide the opportunity for a bridging project that could be finished in full time education hopefully linking learning from ourselves into everyday learning.

Description of the provider: Supporting challenging learners, developing successful students. We promote learning and engagement for vulnerable and challenging children and young people. We develop purposeful and mutually respectful relationships with students; all adults are emotionally available to students to support the healing process of trauma.

We work with our students to improve their attendance, attainment, behaviour, confidence, and self-esteem.

We encourage the development of skills and understanding to become contented, contributing, and responsible young people.

We raise aspiration and expectation to contribute to the well-being and cohesion of the communities we serve. We deliver programmes which recognise that students are all individuals with a wide variety of wants, needs and experiences; acknowledging that a mainstream setting, approach, or curriculum may not be the most appropriate for every child or young person at this moment in time.

We provide our students with a positive experience of education, activity, and relationships whilst they re-integrate to their mainstream school or transition to a new mainstream school, a specialist SEND setting or another long-term placement.

The focus of the provision is supporting young people who struggle with the challenges of transitioning to secondary school, or maintaining a successful position in mainstream education, with the aim of ensuring they can remain without the need for further, more complex intervention at a later stage, and crucially before they are disillusioned and distanced from school.

This is delivered through a relational approach that enables us to devise a curriculum that is relevant to the learner, and in doing so build in challenge and rigour. Wellbeing and self-confidence grow through self-determination (Ryan & Deci, 2000) so that the young person is able to see education as something that they can succeed in, and as such will enable them to continue this success in full time mainstream education.

We work from three design principles that we have in common with our Big Picture colleagues in the United States and around the globe:

- Learning must be based on each individual's interests and needs.
- The curriculum must be relevant to the learners and allow them to do real work in the real world.
- Learners' growth and abilities must be measured by the quality of their work and how it changes them.

As well as learners that are beginning to struggle with behavioural expectations, Big Picture also has a strong success rate with learners returning to school or adjusting to secondary school with a personal and social focus which includes behaviour, anxiety, friendships, decision making etc.

Currently Big Picture has a success rate of over 90% of learners deemed to have made progress under local authority QA processes. Schools with a close working relationship are complimentary about the support offered, the level of intervention and involvement in ensuring integrated work, as well as the impact on young people going on well beyond the end of a placement.

From September 2024 Big Picture Doncaster will be offering 24 places for years 7 and 8 students, and 24 places for learners in years 5 and 6 on a termly basis.

These will be twelve week placements for a maximum of two and a half days a week, and the offer will be further supplemented with follow up work in school where required, and 80 outreach places to support year 6 children with transition in the Summer and Spring Term of 2025.

Outreach support will be through weekly sessions delivered on a 1-2-1 basis and, as with on site placements, will follow a bespoke programme for each learner.



We baseline for an assessment of social and emotional need, using generalised anxiety disorder scores, emotional intelligence scores, personalised risk assessment, and a detailed log of behaviours displayed. This would also be completed at the middle and end of placement to record and monitor the progress these assessments would then feed into an appropriate action plan and individualised package.

Opportunities to gain accreditation in national awards, to ensure building self-esteem and show it is possible to attain a great deal of accreditation, including first aid at work, Mountain Training Awards (we are the only education provision in the UK allowed to give these awards), Canoe England awards, AQA unit awards, evidence for accredited schools to gain BTEC, GCSE, or equivalent. If appropriate we now offer vocational awards in fire safety, health and safety in the workplace, first aid, manual handling, and food safety and hygiene level 2, NCFE level 1 and 2 in Engineering Process (some of our young people have designed and fabricated Christmas trees from horseshoes, other, have made BBQs from gas bottles).

Consistent staff for developing trust, stability with a proven track record of attaining the best outcomes for young people in Doncaster MBC.

Linking the learning done on session to core subjects, we explore a lot of academic work whilst on session and make it relevant to everyday life, such as budgeting a meal, measuring distance, working out timetables and tariffs, bike mechanics and first aid.

Providing a practical approach to the learning need of the young person, i.e., the learning will be done outdoors, in the community, it'll be relevant to lifelong learning, and practical.

Using SEAL and Nurture principles to help develop a wider emotional responses and behaviours and apply these in times of stress.

Using mindfulness, and counselling strategies to help reduce anxieties and stresses that present themselves, to allow fewer negative behaviours, with sessions from our in-house psychotherapist and NLP (Neuro Linguistic Programming) master practitioner to help feed into the young persons individualised package.

We aim to be as approachable and accommodating as we possibly can be as a company, in line with this we make ourselves available for transparent communication, as much as we can to both schools, authorities and carers.

Our phase one intervention is based around initially building rapport, normally in a small group. This allows us to move forwards at the young person's pace.

Phase two would be the young person trying three different activities, this would be generally outdoor education based (climbing, kayaking, navigation, bushcraft), however we can base these activities on

art, mechanics and humanities .We would link learning and activities quite easily to this, in a practical way, e.g. a caving visit to a national trust live archaeological site, in which we would take part in collecting and processing Neolithic artefacts from the Peak District. During these sessions we also work on delivering 'core' subjects, for example the fire triangle, data handling, measuring with biking, kayaking, walking.

Phase three is where we specialise in an area that the young person excels or shows most interest in and we gain them national accreditation if possible (some accreditation is age restricted). We also start to work more intensively on social and emotional responses and self-regulation. We will push for emotional responses and then using SEAL and Nurture principles teach the young person how to regulate their actions.

Phase four is based on reintegration in which we share our reports and strategies with the next step in the young person's educational journey. We also would provide the opportunity for a bridging project that could be finished in full time education hopefully linking learning from ourselves into everyday learning.
