Introduction:

This booklet contains information relating to Alternative providers who have been approved and are able to use the Local Authority Alternative Provision framework.

Although providers are accepted onto the Alternative Provision framework they still have to complete the Local Authority Enhanced Compliance Audit and the Local Authority Quality Assurance Process.

The Local Authority Enhanced Compliance Audit (ECA) process:

The Local Authority has a duty to assess any service that is commissioned to deliver services for children and young people, to ensure full compliance with the requirements set out in the Children Act 2004

An ECA looks at following;

- Leadership and Accountability
- Use of policies and procedures to safeguard children
- Recruitment and Selection
- Staff Induction, Training and Development
- Complaints Allegations and Whistle-blowing
- Information Sharing, communication & Confidentiality
- Listening to Children and Young People

There is no RAG rating as part of this process, the provider has either met or not met the Standards as set out in Section 11 of the Children Act 2014. The Quality Team will start the Full Quality Assurance Process once the Enhanced Compliance Audit has been met

The Local Authority Quality Assurance process:

Quality Assurance is the systematic and transparent process of checking to see if a service meets the specified requirements, and actively involves itself in the assessment against agreed thresholds and standards, to determine the level of quality.

Full QA inspections are carried out on an annual basis; while monitoring visits are scheduled intermittently, to check progress against the quality improvement plan (QIP) created at the initial visit. The summaries displayed throughout this document are a reflection of the annual; QA visit, and in relation to the evidence and observations made on the day of inspection.

Standard Rating (Rag ratings) are judgements made in conjunction with the Local Authorities framework, along with any existing framework by which that provider is judged, for example Ofsted. Any existing grading, judgements or recommendations will be considered within the evidence base as part of this localised framework. Where there is no rating present for example 'Outcomes for Learners' and 'Teaching, Learning & Assessment', this will be due to, no students being in attendance on the date of inspection and therefore the Quality Team were unable to assess that area.

All services are routinely inspected at the start of the contracting period, prior to the placement of any child or young person, or on a scheduled annual basis.

A Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) is set out at this point, and monitored throughout the year; services will be encouraged to routinely set their own annual QIP as a recognised approach to good practice.

We regularly take a selection of learners who have issues of self worth and confidence. Brief description of the provision:

Big Picture Doncaster offers bespoke learning packages predominantly for children in years 7 and 8 who have so far struggled to meaningfully engage with a more traditional offer. This is delivered through a relational approach that enables us to devise a curriculum that is relevant to the learner, and in doing so build in challenge and rigour. Wellbeing and self confidence grows through self determination (Ryan & Deci, 2000) so that the young person is able to see education as something that they can succeed in, and as such will enable them to continue this success in full time mainstream education.

We work from three design principles that we have in common with our Big Picture colleagues in the United States and around the globe:

- Learning must be based on each individual's interests and needs.
- The curriculum must be relevant to the learners and allow them to do real work in the real world.
- Learners' growth and abilities must be measured by the quality of their work and how it changes them.

The exact nature of each package will be personalised to the individual learner but will feature a combination of; face to face coaching and mentoring; access to online and other flipped learning resources; support for personal and social development; development of learning attributes and skills; and the acquisition of new knowledge. Central to our work is the idea of One Student at a Time - as no two learners are the same, no two packages will be.

Individual learning programmes will be set out in a personalised learning plan constructed with the learner, parent, and home school. This will be followed over a fixed period of time; generally twelve weeks, for between one and two and a half days a week.

All learners are part of an advisory of no more than 8-10 children which is the heart of Big Picture schools around the world. Advisors are the key point of contact for the learner as well as the school and home and are responsible for building the curriculum for their learners as well as monitoring and reporting progress. They update personal learning plans (PLPs) and hold regular meetings with school and home. The learning plan contains goals, progress and recommendations for continued support and strategies that can be used in school.

- As they progress and as it is appropriate our learners will have the opportunity to work off-site learning alongside advisors and mentors.
- A vibrant, flexible learning environment that provides equal access to all by adjusting instruction to address learner passions, abilities, and interests
- Accredited workforce development for staff in schools as well as access to local and wider networks of advisors to discuss and refine best practice in supporting the cohort

Brief description of the provision:

Changing Lives Alternative Therapeutic Provision is a Community Interest Company – Not for Profit. The aim of the provision is to provide a therapeutic alternative service for children and young people who have difficulties in, or are disengaged from, education due to mental health difficulties, or have an identified therapeutic need.

We are based in a rural location, allowing a safe outdoor space and a herd of horses to aid our outcomes. We work with children and young people on our site, in school, in their homes and/or on outreach programs, we are very flexible and creative in our approach.

We do not offer curriculum based education, our therapeutic work allows us to identify and resolve underlying psychological and emotional difficulties that impact on education.

Each child/young person referred to the service has an assessment to create a personalised care and intervention plan. Our support is holistic, therefore we can work with the child, their parents/carers and their school, this means everyone supporting the child has the knowledge and skills to effectively help them long term.

At the end of our work we provide an exit report which is shared with the child/young persons family and their school, providing clear recommendations and guidance.

- We will assess the child, family and schools needs, developing an action plan. We use outcome measures to track the success of our interventions.
- We provide training and consultancy for parents/carers and professionals who have a key working role with our children and young people, in order to ensure sustained change and encourage students to reintegrate into mainstream provision, if appropriate.

Brief description of the provision:

Cirque Skills Pathway CIC

Learners attending Cirque will have the opportunity to complete a blended Programme of Study. During the last 4 years, we have become well established in offering Beauty Qualifications through VTCT and Beauty Guild, however we have now expanded to offer further qualifications to allow access for more students.

Students can gain a variety of qualifications which is decided after an initial assessment and understanding individual learning styles and ambitions, along with discussions with the referral partner to understand specific needs and to compliment other areas of learning.

Individual Learning Plan

Each student follows an individual learning plan to create a bespoke education package for their needs to include SEN and personal ambitions. Everyone is different and hence we have a variety of courses to suit each learner's pace and development, this is linked to the number of days on site. As a part time provision, we can have students at the most, 4 days per week. Students will have a timetable of courses which is agreed by the centre to consider learning hours and to compliment other learning at school or other providers.

We offer SEN support and success with complex needs and therapeutic support

The courses we offer all encourage individual learning and each student following their own journey in self chosen modules, which get signed off using a portfolio of evidence, therefore learners can work at their own pace and thus allowing each student to gain suitable qualifications to suit their needs.

Our inhouse Learner Journey Booklet is designed to monitor progress and set standards in behaviour expectations and class rules. Students become re-engaged in learning and reintegrated into mainstream

Unique Selling Points:

We are accredited to deliver VTCT, Highfield, Asdan and Art Award programmes with highly qualified staff and assessors

- We are regularly quality audited by internal and external IQA's to ensure quality in qualifications
- Many of our young people have challenging behaviours and complex circumstances, we create an environment that allows self-expression and less formal than a school setting. We work in improving mind-set and self-worth to improve poor behaviour and attitudes
- NLP practitioner onsite and access to therapeutic support
- Students achieve as many of the qualifications as possible, dependant on their attendance and commitment. This is blended into the programme in practical sessions; however, the theory must also be completed to gain Industry recognised certificates, allowing students to move towards self-employment, apprentices, and further Beauty Courses.

Opportunities to gain accreditation in national awards, to ensure building self-esteem and show it is possible to attain a great deal of accreditation, including first aid at work, Mountain Training Awards (we are the only education provision in the UK allowed to give these awards), Canoe England awards, AQA unit awards, evidence for accredited schools to gain BTEC, GCSE, or equivalent. If appropriate we now offer vocational awards in fire safety, health and safety in the workplace, first aid, manual handling, and food safety and hygiene level 2, NCFE level 1 and 2 in Engineering Process (some of our young people have designed and fabricated Christmas trees from horseshoes, other, have made BBQ's from gas bottles).

Linking the learning done on session to core subjects, we explore a lot of academic work whilst on session and make it relevant to everyday life, such as budgeting a meal, measuring distance, working out timetables and tariffs, bike mechanics and first aid.

Providing a practical approach to the learning need of the young person, i.e. the learning will be done outdoors, in the community, it'll be relevant to lifelong learning, and practical.

Using SEAL and Nurture principles to help develop a wider emotional responses and behaviours and apply these in times of stress.

Using mindfulness, and counselling strategies to help reduce anxieties and stresses that present themselves, to allow fewer negative behaviours, with sessions from our in house psychotherapist and NLP (Neuro Linguistic Programming) master practitioner to help feed into the young persons individualised package.

We aim to be as approachable and accommodating as we possibly can be as a company, in line with this we make ourselves available for transparent communication, as much as we can to both schools, authorities and carers

Our phase one intervention is based around initially building rapport, normally in a small group. This allows us to move forwards at the young person's pace.

Phase two would be the young person trying three different activities, this would be generally outdoor education based (climbing, kayaking, navigation, bushcraft), however we can base these activities on art, mechanics and humanities .We would link learning and activities quite easily to this, in a practical way, e.g. a caving visit to a national trust live archaeological site, in which we would take part in

collecting and processing Neolithic artefacts from the Peak District. During these sessions we also work on delivering 'core' subjects, for example the fire triangle, data handling, measuring with biking, kayaking, walking.

Phase three is where we specialise in an area that the young person excels or shows most interest in and we gain them national accreditation if possible (some accreditation is age restricted). We also start to work more intensively on social and emotional responses and self-regulation. We will push for emotional responses and then using SEAL and Nurture principles teach the young person how to regulate their actions.

Phase four is based on reintegration in which we share our reports and strategies with the next step in the young person's educational journey. We also would provide the opportunity for a bridging project that could be finished in full time education hopefully linking learning from ourselves into everyday learning.

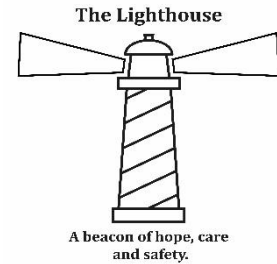

We encourage the development of skills and understanding to become contented, contributing, and responsible young people.

We raise aspiration and expectation to contribute to the well-being and cohesion of the communities we serve. We deliver programmes which recognise that students are all individuals with a wide variety of wants, needs and experiences; acknowledging that a mainstream setting, approach, or curriculum may not be the most appropriate for every child or young person at this moment in time.

We provide our students with a positive experience of education, activity, and relationships whilst they re-integrate to their mainstream school or transition to a new mainstream school, a specialist SEND setting or another long-term placement.

All children and young people that attend The Lighthouse have an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) which identifies the aims and objectives of the placement.

The longer term aims, and objectives are broken down into SMART weekly targets and each student has a 'Daily Target Sheet' (DTS), a weekly report is collated from the DTS and sent to the referring school; this monitors the progress made towards the identified goals.

In addition to the individual goals, students are expected to make progress in six life skills which will impact on their engagement, achievement, and success.

These six areas are:

- Relationships
- Confidence
- Responsibility
- Working with others
- Resilience
- Communication

The programmes offered at The Lighthouse are designed to develop teamwork and communication skills; enhance self-confidence; provide the opportunity to develop new skills, experience new activities, achieve accreditation and push participants outside of their comfort zone.
