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## Important changes to One Front Door

#### From Monday 20th January 2025 the One Front Door form will be turned off.

This will mean a change to the ways you refer to MASH and Early Help. Please read through the following information and make sure that you update your policies, procedures, notice boards and parent information etc

**Social Care:** If you are worried about a child or believe a child to be at risk of any kind of harm please select social care. Social services have a statutory obligation to safeguard and promote the welfare of vulnerable children and can provide a wide range of services to children and their parents, usually within the own home environment and co-ordinated by a social worker. If you are worried about a child because they are at risk of harm and wish to speak to someone, you can contact Doncaster Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH) by calling <u>01302 737777</u> in the **evening or at weekends call** <u>01302 796000</u>.

You will no longer be required to follow a referral up in writing. Please make sure that you keep an accurate record of any concerns you have passed on including who you spoke to and the date and time of the call. Also record any next steps or actions agreed within the call.

#### **Beginning the Early Help Process:**

If a family has agreed to Early Help and you would like the Early Help pathway opened to you as Lead Practitioner, make contact with your local Early Help Coordinator directly or via their duty line: **01302 736250** or <u>earlyhco@doncaster.gov.uk</u>

If a family has agreed to Early Help and you are unsure who is the appropriate Lead Practitioner or believe the family would benefit from this being a worker from specialist service, please phone the Early Help Hub duty line on **01302 734110**.

# EYFSP – Early Years Foundation Stage Profile for Children in FS2

The Department for Education (DfE) has updated the <u>Early Years Foundation Stage</u> (<u>EYFS</u>) Profile handbook, enabling children to use their established or preferred mode of communication, such as signing or other non-verbal methods for all Early Learning Goals (ELGs). This includes the "speaking" ELG, which previously emphasised spoken language.

The change, announced on December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024, reflects growing recognition of diverse communication needs in early education, ensuring inclusivity for children who are non-speaking or use alternative methods to express themselves.

Early years practitioners welcomed the amendment, stating it ensures equitable assessment while honouring each child's unique abilities. The updated handbook advises educators to consider a child's individual communication mode when evaluating progress.

The move aligns with the DfE's broader commitment to fostering accessibility and inclusion, enabling all children to thrive and demonstrate their learning in ways that suit them best.

It is a statutory duty for schools, settings and childminders to complete the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile for each child who is coming to the end of their foundation year, prior to moving into Key Stage 1.

Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> June will be the deadline for this to be submitted to the City of Doncaster Council. More details to follow.

### Don't miss out on your share of wraparound funding!

The first year of the Wraparound Project delivery will be coming to a close at the end 5<sup>th</sup> April 25, with just one more year of the project still to be delivered. This means that only applications received before the 5<sup>th</sup> April 2025 will receive the full amount of funding available. Applications after this date will only be eligible for one year of funding, instead of two full years of funding.

Schools, childminders and PVI are all able to take advantage of this wraparound funding, enabling you to better meet the needs of families and offer a flexible approach to childcare.

There are many benefits of having a wraparound provision – these include:

- Access to potential new markets which you may not have previously reached.
- It provides an additional revenue stream which may increase your overall profitability.
- It increases business sustainability as your financial 'risk' is spread over different types of services.
- It allows a crossover of customer bases where siblings of wraparound children may increase demand for your Early Years places.
- It can strengthen your customer pipeline, helping you keep your customers for longer, as Early Years places often turn into future wraparound places.
- It allows you to provide a more comprehensive and flexible service to families. Your service becomes a one-stop-shop for families, with no need for them to look elsewhere for their childcare needs.

**Funding for wraparound provision is available now!** If you want to expand existing wraparound provision or create new wraparound places, now is the time to act, whilst the full funding is still in place to help. All applications will need to be received before 5<sup>th</sup> April 2025 to guarantee the full two years of funding available.

Applications for wraparound funding to expand existing provision through extending opening hours or creating new places, or to create completely new wraparound provision, are being accepted now. With the expanded early years entitlements roll out, we need to recruit more people than ever into the early years sector to support our families across Doncaster.

## Early Years Financial Incentive- Extended!

Great News- The Early years financial incentive scheme has been extended by the DFE for eligible employees up until the end of March 2025 who work for 12 weeks after that!

Criteria is as follows:

- An employee who is employed between the 1<sup>st</sup> of April 2024 and 31<sup>st</sup> of March 2025 with a eligible provider and recruited to a full or part time position
- Returning to the profession after a 6-month gap
- Works at least 70% of their time with children.
- An apprentice who completes their apprenticeship between 1<sup>st</sup> of April and 31<sup>st</sup> of March 2025 and is given a permanent contract.

The Educational Psychology Team take a lead on this. We sometimes need to think about communicating with children using whole bodies This fab webinar from PACEY with Ruth Churchill Dower is really useful.

It's worth a listen/watch to develop a further understanding of not prioritising speech over other forms of communication and has some great tips on sensory support too, especially good from about 30 mins in.

#### ASCETS – EARLY YEARS GROUP FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN WITH COMMUNICATION DIFFERENCES – WITH OR WITHOUT A DIAGNOSIS OF AUTISM

Doncaster ASCETS team have secured funding to run a regular group for parents to attend with their child with communication learning differences. The child does not have to have a diagnosis of Autism.

This is really exciting news, and we will inform you of venues, times and how parents can access as soon as we have further information

#### SENDIAS ADVICE SESSIONS FOR PARENTS

Doncaster SENDIAS service are starting up advice sessions for parents to book on or drop in to discuss anything to do with support they need in relation to education for their child with SEND.

These will take place at the family Hubs with a SENDIAS officer. There are both bookable sessions and drop-in sessions Each family hub will have different timings and dates.

Parents can book on and gain further information by telephoning their local family hub numbers.

Please note this is not replacing the universal SENDIAS offer. Parents can still contact SENDIAS directly.

#### EHCP REQUESTS FOR STATUTORY ASSESSMENT

It's the main time of year for submitting the requests.

Your area SENCO should already be aware of the requests you have submitted or will be submitting. Educational Psychologists should be made aware of the child via the parent consent for EP (sending this to the Area SENCO to pass onto the EP for where the child lives, along with a few bullet points about the child).

This parental consent gives the EP permission to be invited to APDR meetings which may take place before the submission. It remains the case that EP consent is not required separately to the EHCP assessment request as the parental request for the assessment would include the EP.

To submit a request, you will need a EHC Hub account as we have informed you previously.
